Lantern Festival

Many important events are based on the lunar calendar, and one special day, the fifteenth day of the eighth lunar month, is set aside to celebrate the Mid-Autumn or Moon Festival.

According to the people of Vietnam, this is the day of the year when the moon shines the largest

and brightest. It can occur any evening between late September and early October. The legend that accompanies this festival tells the story of *Hau Duy*, an Imperial officer and expert archer. He was called upon to shoot nine suns that had suddenly appeared in the sky. He was also an excellent architect and built a beautiful jade palace for the goddess of the Western Heaven. The goddess rewarded him

She swallowed the pill and immediately soared to the moon. According to the legend, Hang Nga's beauty is the most radiant on the evening of the Moon festival.

Today, families get together to celebrate the Festival. It is a public holiday and adults enjoy an evening moon gazing while drinking tea and munching on moon cakes. Children, meanwhile, make lanterns out of bamboo and color papers, parading through the streets singing songs. Houses with doors open will welcome the children and give out candies or prizes. In the month of October, our class read a story about the traditions of the Moon Festival. We also made lanterns and hung them from the class ceiling. Mr. Pham made lanterns and paraded with other children when he was a child. David, Thomas, and Xiaoqing had participated in Lantern Festivals in their communities.

Art Time


